

THE MARTYR'S CROWN

Peoples' worship is disrupted when cell phones ring. As a gift to each other, we turn off our cell phone ringers during worship

Matthew Henry concise commentary on today's Gospel:

When we assemble in Christ's name, especially on his holy day, he will meet with us, and speak peace to us. The disciples of Christ should endeavour to build up one another in their most holy faith, both by repeating what they have heard to those that were absent, and by making known what they have experienced. Thomas limited the Holy One of Israel, when he would be convinced by his own method or not at all. He might justly have been left in his unbelief, after rejecting such abundant proofs. The fears and sorrows of the disciples are often lengthened, to punish their negligence.

That one day in seven should be religiously observed, was an appointment from the beginning. And that, in the kingdom of the Messiah, the first day of the week should be that solemn day, was pointed out, in that Christ on that day once and again met his disciples in a religious assembly. The religious observance of that day has come down to us through every age of the church. There is not an unbelieving word in our tongues, nor thought in our minds, but it is known to the Lord Jesus; and he was pleased to accommodate himself even to Thomas, rather than leave him in his unbelief. We ought thus to bear with the weak, (romans 15:1 romans 15:2). This warning is given to all. If we are faithless, we are Christless and graceless, hopeless and joyless. Thomas was ashamed of his unbelief, and cried out, My Lord and my God. He spoke with affection, as one that took hold of Christ with all his might; "My Lord and my God." Sound and sincere believers, though slow and weak, shall be graciously accepted of the Lord Jesus. It is the duty of those who read and hear the gospel, to believe, to embrace the doctrine of Christ, and that

"This is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in His Son" (1 John 5.11)



ANNOUNCEMENTS

DAY OF PRAYER AND FASTING: As was announced in last week's bulletin, we are in a season of financial uncertainty. If the present trend continues, we will not be financially viable after July. Howard+ is calling the parish to a day of prayer and fasting on Saturday, July 9, 10 AM - 4 PM here at the Victory Christian Centre. For those hours we will simply 'seek the Lord's face' in prayer. The desire of our hearts will be to discern what He is saying to us in this situation. We will fast from food during these 6 hours. Of course, it is understand that some may be required to eat for health reasons. The day will conclude with a celebration of the Holy Eucharist.

PLEDGE SUNDAY: Next Sunday will be Pledge Sunday. At that time you will be asked to submit a pledge form indicating what your financial offering will be to St. Stephen the Martyr each week until the end of December. **Every member** is asked to submit a pledge form. While you do not have to sign the form, the amount you commit is between you and God. In other words, you are accountable to Him, not to the rector or the parish leadership. As you prayerfully consider what God is asking of you financially, please remember that St. Stephen the Martyr upholds the biblical tithe as the standard of giving; that is, 10% of your income before deductions. It is generally understood that the local church has the first claim on your tithe. Anything given outside your local church to support other ministries is above and beyond the tithe and is considered a gift. Further, as you make your decision, consider the following: 1) St. Stephen the Martyr now needs \$3,000.00 every week until the end of the year to meet its budget; 2) There are 26 envelope givers at St. Stephen the Martyr; 3) The outcome of Pledge Sunday will

determine whether St. Stephen the Martyr has the financial resources to continue as a viable parish. Pledge sheets are now available. Please take your's with you as you go this afternoon and return it next week.
