Dear Friends,

Welcome to the parish of St. Stephen the Martyr. It is my sincere wish that your worship experience with us will be a positive one. If we can help you in any way, please make your need known either to me or another member of the congregation.

Here at St. Stephen the Martyr, we are particularly mindful of the power of prayer. Should you desire prayer for yourself or someone else, there are people ready and willing to pray with you.

For those who may not be familiar with who we are, St. Stephen the Martyr is a parish in the Anglican Network in Canada (ANiC). ANiC is a diocese in the Anglican Church in North America and part of the world wide Fellowship of Confessing Anglicans. Our churches are spread from St. John's to Vancouver Island. ANiC is part of the resurgence in North America of orthodox Anglicanism- the historic, Biblically faithful, authentic way of following Jesus and being part of the "One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church." Our mission is to Build Biblically faithful, Gospel sharing, Anglican Churches.

One of the greatest privileges of my life was to attend, in June, the Global Anglican Future Conference (GAFCON) held in Jerusalem. What an incredible experience it was to worship with nearly 2000 Anglican leaders from 50 nations around the world! GAFCON, representing 70% of the Anglican world wide Communion, is a movement within the Communion that stands against "the collapse of biblical witness in parts of the Anglican Communion." There is a deepening sense that GAFCON is an anointed God ordained movement. The evidence of this was in the remarkable unity we witnessed in all aspects of our time together in Jerusalem.

One of the highlights of GAFCON for me was worshiping on the Temple steps, the steps on which Jesus himself walked, with my brothers and sisters from all over the world! It was probably in this place that Peter preached his sermon on the day of Pentecost and 3000 were baptized. It is difficult to put into words what it was like to actually be there except to say, the Glory of the Lord was there! Standing there, I had a very real sense of the call of Jesus to the first disciples, "...that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed

to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witness of these things." (Luke 24.47-48)

Friends, that mandate was the theme of GAFCON 2018- "Proclaiming Christ faithfully to the nations." It must remain our mandate as the people of St. Stephen the Martyr!
