

Dear Friends,


Welcome to worship. Happy Father's Day to the men of the congregation! Today is known as Trinity

Sunday, a celebration of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Since the 10th Century, the church has celebrated the Holy Trinity on the Sunday after Pentecost. This is most fitting as we contemplate the wonder of our Salvation, won for us by the Son, sent from the Father in the power of the Holy Spirit. The word "trinity" is not found in Holy Scripture but God as three persons is referenced in many places. The Trinity celebrates the mystery of one God in three Persons. While we can never fathom the depth of this mystery, it can be helpful to think of God the Father as Creator, God the Son as Redeemer and God the Holy Spirit as Sanctifier and Sustainer.
