Finally, St. Stephen the Martyr is a parish in the Anglican Network in Canada (ANiC). ANiC is a diocese in the Anglican Church in North America and part of the Global Anglican Fellowship of Confessing Anglicans (GAFCON). Our churches are spread from Bonavista to Vancouver Island. ANiC is part of the resurgence in North America of orthodox Anglicanism-the historic, Biblically faithful, authentic way of following Jesus and being part of the "One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church." Our mission is to Build Biblically faithful, Gospel sharing, Anglican Churches.
