Readings for the week of May 1/22:

Acts 9:1-6, (7-20)
Psalm 30
Revelation 5:11-14
John 21:1-19

In these readings, we see two examples of what can happen when we listen to God.

In John 21: 4-6, we read, "Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, you have no fish, have you?" They answered him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish."

In the Acts 9 reading, we read about how Saul was persecuting Christians, and in some cases, he was murdering them. Despite this, when Saul became blind, God sent Ananias to pray for him. Saul was healed, and immediately began spreading the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ.
