## Exodus 24:12-18, Psalm 99, 2 Peter 1:16-21, Matthew 17:1-9

## Matt 17:2 And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white.

The last Sunday before Lent is Transfiguration Sunday. It is a time when Jesus took Peter, James and John up a high mountain and before their eyes he was transfigured. That means he was dazzling! His clothes where so white it was hard on the eyes. The apostles found it hard to look at him. It was like trying to look at the sun on a bright day. Your eyes get spotty and you can't look for more than a second or two.
