• READINGS: <u>Numbers 21:4-9</u> • <u>Psalm 107:1-3, 17-22</u> • <u>Ephesians 2:1-10</u> • <u>John 3:14-21</u>

Ephesians 2:8-9 For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God--not the result of works, so that no one may boast.

What does it mean to be saved by grace? I have thought a lot about that, and to me it means that God the Father sent the Son (Jesus) to bring us salvation, not by anything we did or could have done, but simply because He, the Father, loves us so much.
